The new Subcommittee Chair and Vice-Chair made it a goal to redirect SEMPER’s objectives and goals to better align with the EMI SIG Steering Committee’s and determine the future of SEMPER’s working/task groups. As such, the following represent SEMPER’s objectives going into the rest of 2025 and beyond.*

2025-2026 Objectives	Value
Work with the Emergency Management Advisory Committee (EMAC) to establish a joint working group focused on the integration between emergency management departments and security departments across the complex.	A Joint working group effort between SEMPER and the EMAC will directly contribute to EMISIG’s goal to foster safety, security, and technology initiatives.
Reform the Emergency Operations Center Working Group, under a new title and new leadership, to facilitate benchmarking and discussion on EOC successes, challenges, and new ideas. The group will also focus on the comparison of overall staffing levels across emergency management departments	A revitalized EOC and Staffing Levels Working Group within SEMPER will allow for benchmarking to occur across the complex related to EOC lessons learned and EM program staffing configurations. Such benchmarking will allow sites to justify investment into related areas at their locations.
SEMPER, through the Emergency Operations Center Working Group, will revise and distribute the staffing levels survey created in FY23 and compile and analyze the results.	
Recommend the closure of 2 legacy task groups and 1 legacy working group to the EMISIG Steering Committee.	The recommendation of the closure of SEMPER’s legacy task and working groups will allow SMEPER to open up opportunity to explore future task and working group concepts.
